The Octave Day of Christmas

Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God (January 1)

Mary is the perfect role model for living a stewardship lifestyle. She listened to God and answered “yes” to His invitation to be the Holy Mother of His son. She also trusted in God’s providence on a daily basis. 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time (February 5)

6th Sunday in Ordinary Time (February 12)
