Re:

Heating Systems, Flues & Exhaust Maintenance

In addition to the boiler and pressure vessel inspections conducted by Chubb Loss Control Services, all diocesan buildings heated by a fossil fuel (gas, oil, wood, etc.) must have chimney and flue pipes inspected by a licensed HVAC plumber prior to October 31, 2017.

Diocesan buildings with exhaust systems insufficiently maintained experienced the largest "per unit" claim losses in 2016. Preventative maintenance not only reduces potential future loss but also extends the operating life of the heating units and promotes the safety of our employees.



Mrs. Elva M. Fye of Nanty Glo was a weekly viewer of our live TV Mass for nearly three decades and she made regular gifts to our Minute-a-Month Ministry iniative in appreciation of how much the telecast meant to her.

Her monthly gift often included a letter of praise for the efforts of our TV Ministry volunteers in making it possible for her to partcipate in the Liturgy in her home when she was unable to get to church in person.

The Funeral Mass for Mrs. Fye was celebrated at Saint Mary's Catholic Church in Nanty Glo.

In her obituary notice, the family requested that, instead of flowers, donations be made to charity in her memory. As we pray for her, we ask her to pray for us, confident that one day we shall see her again.

The Mass is repeated at 9 pm Sundays on the Atlantic Broadband Public Access Channel 9.

The Faith and Family Channel also repeats the Mass at 6 am Wednesdays and 4 pm Thursdays.

In the near future WATM-TV will begin to livestream its programming, affording even more opportunities to arttract an even larger viewership.

The ever-growing presence of TV programs on social media is opening a new venue for those who prefer to watch the Mass at nearly anywhere at anytime or at a time and place that is in keeping with their schedule. Recent past
