November 2016 (Cycle C)

32th Sunday in Ordinary Time (Nov 6)

Jesus' disciples give thanks to God for their talents and abilities by using them to build up the Kingdom in their midst.

33th Sunday in Ordinary Time (Nov 13)

"Mature disciples make a conscious, firm decision, carried out in action, to be followers of Jesus Christ no matter the cost to themselves." (*Stewardship: A Disciple's Response; USCCB*)

Christ the King (Nov 20)

November 2016 (Cycle A)

1st Sunday in Advent (Nov 27)

Good stewards know they are accountable and use their gifts to do God's will. Stay awake for opportunities to share your time, talents and treasures!

December 2016 (Cycle A)

2nd Sunday of Advent (Dec 4)

A lifestyle of discipleship and stewardship – with God at the very center – is precisely what all baptized Believers are called to fulfill. May we recognize our dependence upon God by giving Him thanks in all our deeds.

3rd Sunday of Advent (Dec 11)

4th Sunday of Advent (Dec 18)
