
Bishop Mark To Celebrate Nov. 20 Jubilee Year TV Mass

Bishop Mark L. Bartchak will be the Principal Celebrant and Homilist for the hour-long live telecast of the November 20 Mass marking the conclusion of the Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy.

The Jubilee Year began on the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, December 8, 2015. It was declared by Pope Francis on March 13, 2015, in his papal bull of indiction "The Face of Mercy." The opening day was also the fiftieth anniversary of the closing of the Second Vatican Council.

The official logo shows Jesus, the personifi-

cation of Mercy. carrying on
His shoulders a "lost man",
emphasizing how deep the
Savior touches humanity; His
eyes are merged with those of
the carried man, meaning that
Jesus is carrying the man out
of the darkness of sin. On one
side the image is also joined



by the official motto: Merciful Like the Father, which stands as an invitation to follow the example of the Father by loving and forgiving without limits.

Pope Francis emphasized that the Jubilee be celebrated not only in Rome, but throughout the entire world; for the first time holy doors are open in a cathedral or in historical churches. In his Papal Bull, the Holy Father stated, "The Holy Door will become a door of Mercy through which anyone who enters will experience the love of God who consoles, pardons, and instils hope."

The opening of the holy door at Saint Peter's marked the first time two pope were present, with Pope Francis inviting Pontiff Emeritus Benedict.
