

"At OLV, children are encouraged at whatever stage they are musically," she says. "For example, just learning to play a steady beat is challenging for some, while others need a complex rhythm. Music class is a time where all children can come together and be expressive through music. It doesn't matter where they are academically—music puts everyone on the same playing field, where each student gets to be an individual."

At OLV, the benefits of music are well recognized, and Capozzi is grateful for the support the program has.

"It has been proven that children who study music have increased test scores," she says. "Music learning supports ALL learning. It's not that Mozart makes you smarter, but music improves attention, memory, and even your ability to do mental math. It can also help lessen depression and anxiety."

Even though she has only been teaching music at OLV for two years, Capozzi brings experience to the classroom as a musician.

"The musician in me developed over several years. By high school, everything I

was a part of revolved around music—every play and musical, as well as two choirs and band."

Naturally, Capozzi was drawn to teaching, to share her passion for music with others and giving them something long after they've left OLV.

"My goal is to teach my students something they can take outside the classroom and continue to use for the rest of their lives."
