**Recent TV Masses Now Available to All on The Internet**

***Monsignor Timothy P. Stein, 60,  
Editor of The Catholic Register,  
Dies at His Altoona Parish Rectory***

As we go to press with the May edition of the TV newsletter, we are saddened to learn of the passing of a veteran priest and journalist of the Altoona-Johnstown Diocese.

Monsignor Timothy P. Stein, 60, died May 20 at Saint Mary (Immaculate Conception) rectory, Altoona, where he had served as Pastor since 2004.

Monsignor Stein was well-known for his role as Editor of the Diocesan newspaper, *The Catholic Register* for nearly 30 years.

A viewing for Monsignor Stein was held at Saint Mary Parish on Monday, April 23, with the funeral Mass at 10 am Tuesday, April 24, at Saint Mary. The Mass was celebrated by the Most Reverend Mark L. Bartchak, Bishop of Altoona-Johnstown.

The family has requested that, in lieu of flowers, memorial contributions may be made to the Saint Mary's Improvement Fund, 1405 Fifth Avenue, Altoona, PA 16602

In addition to our hour-long live telecast of the Sunday Mass from Saint John Gualbert Cathedral in Johnstown every Sunday at 11 am, we are now able to offer additional options to those wishing to view the TV Mass at anytime.

We are thankful to the Communications Office of the Altoona-Johnstown Diocese and its Director **Tony Degol** for providing us with the use of the website space.

Thanks also goes out to our Chief Engineer **Joe Delso** and **Becky Wicks** of Wix-Pix Productions for providing us with the technical expertise needed to make the Mass available to many thousands of additional viewers on the Internet.

The expansion of our Mass telecast to those who watch on their home computers means a significant extension of our Ministry to anyone with an internet connection.
